


St. Joseph Community Health Early Childhood Survey October 2011

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I. INTRODUCTION



Methodology

This study, conducted by Research & Polling, Inc., was commissioned by St. Joseph Community Health. The objective of the study was to measure public opinion regarding early childhood education programs in New Mexico.

The Interview

A statewide random sample of 603 adults living in New Mexico was interviewed by telephone. All interviews were conducted between August 24th and September 5^{th} , 2011.

The telephone interviewers are professionals who are brought together for a training session prior to each survey. This ensures their complete and consistent understanding of the survey instrument.

Margin of Error

A sample size of 603 at a 95% confidence level provides a maximum margin of error of approximately 4.0%. In theory, in 95 out of 100 cases, the results based on a sample of 603 will differ by no more than 4.0 percentage points in either direction from what would have been obtained by interviewing all adults living in New Mexico.

Sample Bias

In any survey, there are some respondents who will refuse to speak to the professional interviewer. A lower response rate among certain types of individuals can result in a sample wherein certain types of individuals are over-represented or under-represented. The potential for sampling bias increases as the response rate decreases. Research & Polling, Inc. often sets quotas for various segments of the population who are historically undercounted. This has the effect of minimizing, but not necessarily eliminating, sampling bias.

The Report

This report summarizes the results from each question in the survey and reports on any variances in attitude or perception, where significant, among demographic subgroups. The subgroups examined in this report include: age, gender, education, household income, ethnicity, region, voter registration, and children in the household.

Executive Summary

The results of a statewide telephone survey among a random sample of 603 adult residents in New Mexico show a perceived need for greater state involvement in early childhood education programs. Approximately four-in-five (78%) residents statewide feel early childhood education for children under the age of 5 is important, with 66% saying early childhood education is *very important*. Given the perceived importance of early childhood education, it is not surprising that seven-in-ten of the residents surveyed support the State of New Mexico dedicating more funds to early childhood education programs.

Not only do the large majority of residents support more early childhood education programs, most feel an appropriate way to fund such programs is through use of the state's Land Grant Permanent Fund. In fact, after being informed of how the state Permanent Fund is currently used for education and the current amount being distributed, 71% of residents say they would support allocating an additional 1.5% of the Permanent Fund to be used for early childhood education programs, while just 14% say they are opposed to the idea.

Using the Permanent Fund to pay for early childhood education programs would require an amendment to the state's constitution that would have to be approved by the voters. To this end, the vast majority (80%) of residents surveyed believe the state legislature should pass a resolution that would put an early childhood funding amendment to the voters and let them decide whether or not the Permanent Fund should be used to support early childhood education programs.

Given the current economic climate and a resistance by many voters to spend more on government services, it is impressive that the large majority of residents support funding for early childhood education programs in the state. This may be attributable to the fact that education is seen as the major issue facing children in New Mexico and there is clearly a perceived need for the state to do more to address the issue. For example, when asked in an unaided, open-ended manner what is the biggest problem or issue facing children in New Mexico, poor quality of education is mentioned by 39% of residents, while lack of parental involvement/bad parenting is mention second most often with 16%.

Further evidence of the importance of education to residents in New Mexico is found when residents were asked in an closed ended manner to rate how serious of a problem various issues are facing the state. The majority of residents believe children's achievement in school (61%) and children entering school prepared to learn (57%) are serious problems in New Mexico. It should be noted that two-thirds of the residents surveyed also view childhood poverty to be a serious problem in New Mexico.

To help build even greater support for the using the Permanent Fund to develop and pay for early childhood education programs, the public will have to be educated on the issues involved. For instance, there is low overall awareness of the Permanent Fund's existence. Just 24% of residents say they had heard of the Permanent Fund prior to the survey and in total, just 7% of all residents are aware the Permanent Fund currently has a balance exceeding \$10 billion. In addition to informing residents of the Permanent Fund, it will also help to educate residents on the importance of early childhood education programs as it relates to improving overall academic performance and can lead to a more educated and productive workforce.

Residents were asked in an unaided, open-ended manner, what they feel are the biggest issues facing children in New Mexico. The most frequently mentioned response is the educational system is poor (39%), followed by lack of parental involvement/bad parenting (13%), illegal drug use (12%), poverty (11%), and hunger (7%).

Residents were asked to rate the seriousness of various issues facing New Mexico children using a 5-point scale, where a score of 5 means *very serious problem* and a score of 1 means *not a problem at all.* Overall, the child poverty rate is rated as the biggest issue (among the items tested in the survey), with two-thirds of residents who feel this is a serious problem facing New Mexico children (40% say it is a *very serious problem*).


The majority of residents also believe children's achievement in school (61%), children entering school prepared to learn (57%), and childhood nutrition (55%) are serious problems facing children in New Mexico.


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Nearly half (48%) of residents statewide believe affordability of early childhood education programs is a problem in the state. Furthermore, approximately half (47%) of the residents surveyed believe the availability of parent education or coaching programs is an issue in the state. Overall, approximately two-fifths (38%) of residents rate the availability of early childhood care and education programs as being a serious problem.

It is interesting that while less than two-fifths of state residents rate the availability of childhood care and education programs as a serious problem, 48% believe affordability of childhood education programs is a serious issue. It should also be noted that 56% of residents with a children age five or under say affordability of early childhood education programs is a serious problem.

As shown above, over three-quarters (78%) of residents feel the issue of early childhood education for children under the age of five in New Mexico is important, with two-thirds who rate it as *very important*. Approximately one-in-ten (11%) residents do not feel this issue of early childhood education is important as indicated by a score of 1 or 2 on a 5-point scale.


Residents were asked if they believe New Mexico's state government is doing *too much, the right amount,* or *too little* to ensure that children enter kindergarten prepared with the skills they need to do their best in school. As shown in the graph on the right, nearly three-fifths of residents (58%) feel that New Mexico's state government is doing *too little,* while one-quarter feel that it is doing *the right amount.* Just 8% of residents feel state government is doing *too much* to ensure that children are prepared for kindergarten.

When asked about their awareness of various early childhood programs and/or services available in the community, two-thirds say they are aware of Pre-K education programs. While the Pre-K education programs appear to be relative well known, just two-fifths of residents statewide say they are aware of programs designed for at-risk children. Furthermore, just one-third (32%) of residents say they are aware of parenting instruction or coaching programs and 27% are aware of home visitation programs for young children and their parents.







Residents were asked to rate their support or opposition to the State of New Mexico dedicating more funds to early childhood programs using a 5-point scale where 5 is *strongly support* and 1 is *strongly oppose*. As shown above, seven-in-ten state residents support dedicating more state funds to early childhood programs with the majority who *strongly support* it (54%). Fourteen percent of residents oppose the state dedicating more funds to early childhood programs (10% *strongly oppose*).

Residents who are more inclined to say they strongly support dedicating more funds for early childhood education programs include:


- Women (58%) compared to men (49%)
- Those with a household income less than \$20,000 (65%)
- Those who say they are not registered to vote (66%) compared to those who say they are registered to vote (52%)






Overall, most New Mexico residents are not well informed about the New Mexico Land Grant Permanent Fund. After being given a brief explanation of the fund, just under one-quarter of residents (24%) surveyed say they were aware of the state's Permanent Fund for education prior to the survey. Furthermore, just 27% of those who say they know about the fund are aware that the current balance of the permanent fund is over \$10 billion. This represents just 7% of all New Mexico residents.

It should be noted that older residents are more likely to be aware of the Permanent Fund than are younger residents. Two-fifths of the seniors surveyed say they are aware of the Permanent Fund compared to just 12% of those under the age of 35 and 18% of those between the ages of 35 and 49. Furthermore, as levels of education and household income increase, so too does awareness of the Permanent Fund.

Residents were informed of the average growth rate and current distribution of education funding of the Permanent Fund and asked to rate their level of support for or opposition to a constitutional amendment that would dedicate an additional 1.5% of the fund to be used for early childhood programs in the state.

As shown above, approximately seven-in-ten residents (71%) would support the proposal to fund early childhood programs (combined ratings of 4 or 5), with the majority (57%) who say they would *strongly support* this constitutional amendment. Fourteen percent of residents say they would oppose the constitutional amendment to distribute an additional 1.5% of the Permanent Fund annually for early childhood programs.

Interestingly, those who are more likely than others to say they *strongly support* this proposed constitutional amendment include: residents whose annual household income is less than \$20,000 (78%), residents who live in the North Central region of New Mexico (72%), those who have children between birth and five years of age (69%), Hispanics (67%), those who have a high school education or less (65%), and Democrats (66%).

Four-in-five residents also say they support the state legislature passing a bill (resolution) that would send the early childhood funding amendment to the voters. Just 12% oppose, while 6% volunteer that it depends.




